SPIRITUAL

"Let the Word of God dwell in you richly." - Colossians 3:16

To lead the student under the guidance and power of the Holy Spirit:

- I. Into a study and personal application of the Scriptures so that they will build Christ-like qualities of character into their life.
- II. To desire to share their spiritual experience with others.
- III. To achieve a personal relationship with the Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

INTELLECTUAL

"The reverence of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom, and the knowledge of the Holy One is understanding." - Proverbs 9:10

To provide the student with the necessary resources and learning environment to:

- I. Aid in the discovery and development of God-given intellectual abilities and to recognize the Christian obligation to use them constructively.
- II. Stimulate reasoning, academic investigation, creative and critical thinking.
- III. Impart a command of common knowledge and skills and develop ability to adapt in a rapidly changing society.
- IV. Develop the individual's mind to its maximum.

PHYSICAL

"Do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit who is in you, whom you have from God, and that you are not your own? For you have been bought with a price: therefore glorify God in your body." - 1 Corinthians 6:19-20

To develop within each student:

- I. Coordination, grace, poise in movement, muscle tone and balance, endurance and agility to each student's potential.
- II. A respect for and proper use of time.
- III. Desirable habits in the care of the body.
- IV. A respect for the body as a part of the temple of the Holy Spirit.

SOCIAL

"For the equipping of the saints for the work of service, to the building up of the body of Christ;...Let no unwholesome word proceed from your mouth, but only such a word as is good for edification according

to the need of the moment, that it may give grace to those who hear. And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, by whom you were sealed for the day of redemption. Let all bitterness and wrath and anger and clamor and slander be put away from you, along with all malice. And be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving each other, just as God in Christ also has forgiven you." - Ephesians 4:12, 29-32

To aid each student in the ability to:

- I. Show respect for parents, courtesy and love for the family, and to help the student assume responsibility within the family unit.
- II. Develop their responsibility for good sportsmanship, honesty and concern for the rights of others through Christ-like behavior in any group to which they belong.

EMOTIONAL
